Abstract

Records of a project to survey the landscape, structures, and cultural resources of the Hanalei ahupua'a on the Island of Kaua'i. Undertaken by 1000 Friends of Kauai, in association with Land and Community Associates, Eugene, Oregon and Charlottesville, Virginia, the project was supported by the Historic Sites Section, Division of State Parks, Department of Land and Natural Resources, State of Hawai'i, the Critical Issues Fund of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, the Wallace Alexander Gerbode Foundation, and the G.N. Wilcox Trust. Project records have been arranged into six series: Hanalei Cultural Landscape Survey Records; Historic Structures Data Sheets, Structure Photographs, and Site Plans; Surveys; Other Reference Information; Research by Christopher Wood; and Oral History Interview Transcripts and Audiocassette Tapes. Most of the records were created by project staff Barbara Robeson and Beryl Blaich and consultant Robert Z. Melnick, and date from 1986-1988.

The Hanalei Cultural Landscape Survey Records contain a retrospective report, correspondence, contracts, financial information, and products of the project, including "Hanalei Design Guidelines Handbook," "Hanalei Cultural Resources Management Plan," a project progress report, draft summary report, other historical and background reports, and the original project proposal.

Historic Structures Data Sheets, Structure Photographs, and Site Plans are the raw data gathered by surveying property and structures in the Hanalei area in 1986. Included is information on each site, zoning, original and present use, condition, threats, style, size, appearance, construction materials, foundation, and other features and history, as well as black and white photographs of each structure.

Additional raw data are contained in the three sets of Surveys of Hanalei residents, shoppers, and visitors, all taken in 1987. Other Reference Information and Oral History Interview Audiocassette Tapes consist primarily of 11 oral history audiocassette tapes, transcripts, and some releases, all of 1981-1989 interviews with Hanalei residents. On VHS videotape is an oral history "Talk Story" session with Harry Ho, Kenichi Tasaka and Elsie Pauole, prepared as part of the 1987 "Hanalei: Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow II" program.

Finally, there are letters, research, writings, and copies of deeds, mortgages, and leases to property held by Princeville Plantation Company and other holdings in the Hanalei area, all collected or created by Christopher Wood. Wood also indexed and annotated these documents. The originals of the land records date from 1848- 1937 and were copied and indexed by Wood in 1988. Christopher Wood retains copyright to his writings.

History

The Hanalei Project was undertaken by the 1000 Friends of Kauai ("Friends"), in association with Land and Community Associates, Eugene, Oregon and Charlottesville, Virginia. The Project was an outgrowth of a rural landscape preservation conference in Hanalei and became "a community endeavor to plan for Hanalei's growth while conserving the special scenic and natural resources, the archaeological, historic landmarks, the agriculture and the local lifestyle."

In November 1985, the Friends contracted with Land and Community Associates and principal Robert Z. Melnick to perform a cultural landscape inventory of Hanalei and Wai'oli ahupua'a. The project was sponsored by the Friends, and supported through a survey grant from the Historic Sites Section, Division of State Parks, Department of Land and Natural Resources, State of Hawai'i. Other funding came from the Critical Issues Fund of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, the Wallace Alexander Gerbode Foundation, and the G.N. Wilcox Trust.

The purpose of this survey was to record and understand various landscape resources of Hanalei, with an eventual goal of preparing a nomination for these significant cultural landscapes to the National Register of Historic Sites. Project members reviewed existing studies of the valley bottom area, identified rural landscape components, and inventoried cultural resources to locate information about land use categories, structures, circulation networks, and small-scale elements.

In addition to project director Melnick, other Land and Community Associates project staff were Genevieve P. Keller, architectural historian, and J. Timothy Keller. Kaua'i residents Barbara M. Robeson, Beryl Blaich, Carol Wilcox, and Karol Haraguchi served as project coordinator, community education coordinator, and project assistants, respectively. Kaua'i Historical Society was a project advisor and Barnes Riznik served as Project Advisory Committee Chair.

The area actually surveyed included Hanalei ahupua'a up the valley to Hanalei Homesteads, and Hanalei town. The inventory of the Wai'oli area was eliminated after a field visit in March 1986. The total area surveyed was approximately 2200 acres covering 37 square miles and including 396 separate taro terraces (lo'i) 81 structures and 3 major irrigation systems. Although primarily a survey of landscape resources, pre-1940 buildings and structures also were surveyed and recorded.

The project results included the mapping of the ahupua'a, photographing and describing of Hanalei buildings for placement in the Hawai'i inventory of historic sites, and several oral history interviews of local residents. The project reports and raw materials of the project are among the records placed with Kaua'i Historical Society. The oral history interviews are not for publication.

Scope and Content Note

The Hanalei Project records focus on the Hanalei Cultural Landscape Survey reports, information-gathering surveys of structures and persons, research, and oral history interviews. The records have been arranged into six series: Hanalei Cultural Landscape Survey Records; Historic Structures Data Sheets, Structure Photographs, and Site Plans; Surveys; Other Reference Information; Research by Christopher Wood; and Oral History Interview Audiocassette Tapes.

Hanalei Cultural Landscape Survey Records

The Hanalei Cultural Landscape Survey Records are arranged roughly in reverse chronological order, following a 1995 retrospective report on the project, and a file of correspondence, contracts, and financial information. "Re-Viewing the Hanalei Project," prepared by Beryl Blaich and Barbara Robeson for presentation at the Preserving Hawaii's Traditional Landscapes Conference, September 15, 1995, provides an overview of the project and its accomplishments.

The survey records include correspondence, contracts, invoices, and payment information, September 1985-November 1986. Among the correspondents were Robert Z. Melnick, Land and Community Associates; the Hawaii Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) and Barnes Riznik, Waioli Corporation and chairman of the Project Advisory Committee. Contracts were executed between the DLNR and the State Historic Preservation Officer and 1000 Friends of Kaua'i. These files document the administrative and operational aspects of the projects.

In June 1988, the Hanalei Project and Land and Community Associates produced a "Hanalei Design Guidelines Handbook," as part of a cooperative effort to protect the visual appeal of the community, and its buildings and open space. The guidelines describe and explain the major building types that characterize the built environment of Hanalei; identify essential features of existing buildings and their relationship to the larger landscape; suggest ways in which rehabilitation, additions, and new construction could occur while maintaining the character of buildings essential to the spirit of Hanalei, and outline attitudes and techniques by which existing buildings in Hanalei best could be preserved and maintained.

The "Hanalei Cultural Resources Management Plan" was created in April 1988 by the Hanalei Project and Land and Community Associates to help plan the effort to identify and conserve natural, agricultural, scenic, archaeological, historical, architectural and cultural resources. Included in the volume are residents' thoughts on Hanalei, information on resources, analysis of major conditions and issues; goals, objectives, and activities; and land use protection tools and techniques. Appendices are comprised of analyses of surveys of residents, shoppers, and visitors, and a bibliography.

Also produced by project staff and Land and Community Associates during 1988 were two issues of the "Hanalei Community Newsletter," numbers 1 and 2, entitled "Summary of Hanalei Cultural Resources Management Plan" and "Summary of Hanalei Design Guidelines Handbook." These issues provide summary information for the community. Produced in February 1988 was a "Project Update," a progress report prepared by Barbara Robeson and Beryl Blaich.

In December 1986, Land and Community Associates released a Hanalei Cultural Landscape Survey draft summary report. A copy of the draft report and accompanying maps and copies of aerial photographs are present in the records. The draft report generated correspondence and comments, much of it routine in nature, but also a letter from Carol Wilcox outlining criticisms of the draft report.

Other reports relating to the project include "The Prospect from This Hill: The Hanalei Cultural Landscape Survey," volume 2, 1986, consisting mainly of survey data and sketches, with little text; and "A Comprehensive

Chronicle of Land Use, Hanalei Valley, Kauai, through 1940,” October 1986, prepared by Carol L. Silva, historical researcher.

The original project proposal was entitled “The Hanalei Project: A Cooperative Planning and Cultural Landscape Preservation Initiative.” It was submitted by 1000 Friends of Kauai to the Critical Issues Fund, National Trust for Historic Preservation in March 1986. Also present is a 1986 listing of all Hanalei TMK's (Tax Map Keys) and property owners.

Historic Structures Data Sheets, Structure Photographs, and Site Plans

Much raw data used to prepare the project reports are present in the Historic Structures Data Sheets and Structure Photographs, with some building Site Plans also present. All data was gathered in 1986 by 1000 Friends of Kauai and Land and Community Associates. Barbara Robeson did much of the surveying. Base data was obtained from the County of Kaua'i Real Property Tax Office. The files are in order by TMK number.

The Historic Structures Data Sheets list the owner's name and address, date surveyed; and describe the site, zoning, original and present use of the building, condition, threats to the structure, general style groups, height, facade width, wings and additions, principal roof configuration, roof and exterior wall materials, principal lanai type and integrity, foundation treatment and materials, distinguishing features of building and site, outbuildings, site integrity, cultural/ethnic affiliations, persons or events of significance associated with the structure, quadrangle map used, UTM data, the direction the building faces, and surveyor's comments. There are some discrepancies in the recording of ownership information for rented structures. Both owner and renter were listed if known, otherwise only the renter has been listed. Also included in the files are descriptions of the structures and property, including what alterations or preservation has been done in the past.

The Structure Photographs are comprised of 3 1/2" x 5" black and white prints of the structure affixed to a sheet with site survey number (TMK number), address, initials of the photographer, date, and comments. Another number also included, whose meaning or use is unknown. Many of the Site Plans have not been filled in, and some information on the forms is incomplete or unknown.

There are also two folders of Historic Structures Data Sheets, Structure Photographs, Site Plans, Hawai'i Register of Historic Places Historic Sites Information and Review Forms, and National Register of Historic Places Nomination Forms, 1986. Some of this information duplicates that on the individual sheets listed above, but there are some additions not present elsewhere. Another folder holds Notes, Miscellaneous Materials, and Permissions to Survey. The latter are forms signed and completed by property owners permitting project staff to enter private property to conduct the survey.

Surveys

Additional raw data are contained in the responses to three sets of Surveys of Hanalei residents, shoppers, and visitors, all taken in 1987.

The Hanalei Residents Survey files consist of instructions to surveyors and those answering questionnaires and notes concerning the distribution of surveys, 1987; tabulations of answers; and survey forms completed by residents. The forms are arranged by the name or initials of the surveyors. Residents from the Hanalei Bridge area to the end of the road were surveyed to determine what they liked about living in Hanalei and what they envisioned the area to be like in the future. Completed survey forms were analyzed and interpreted by Land and Community Associates and the results of all surveys incorporated into the final project report.

The Hanalei Project Shoppers Surveys of residents and visitors were taken at Ching Young Village and Kauhale Center on several days in May 1987. Tabulations of results and completed survey forms are present. The Hanalei Visitor Surveys also include tabulations and survey forms.

Other Reference Information and Oral History Interview Audiocassette Tapes

Other Reference Information is comprised of materials gathered and used in research for the final report or collected as part of the project. Included is a copy of "Hanalei Yesterday," a newspaper published in 1990. Also present are 11 oral history audiocassette tapes, transcripts, and some releases, all of 1981- 1989 interviews with Hanalei residents.

Research by Christopher Wood

The final series in the collection consists of letters, research, writings, and copies of deeds, mortgages, and leases, all collected or created by Christopher Wood. Wood collected copies of Kaua'i and Hanalei land records, which he indexed and occasionally annotated with comments. Included in this series is a file of Wood's 1987-1988 correspondence with Barbara Robeson and copies of deeds not listed elsewhere in the indexes. Another file contains Woods notes, writings, maps, and notes of Carol Silva on the draft summary of findings for final project report.

Among Woods papers are copies of deeds, mortgages, and leases for property in the Hanalei area. The originals of these are dated from 1848- 1870, with his letter and list dated 1987. Also present are Woods handcopied versions of deeds from Albert S. Wilcox to Hanalei Land Co., Ltd. and Kalahikai Land Co., Ltd., Princeville, 1916. These were compiled by Wood in May 1988 and are not photocopies of original documents.

Several folders of Woods papers gathered in 1988 concern Princeville Plantation Company. There is an index of land conveyances to others and copies of the original land documents, 1875-1937. The index lists deeds and leases, recording data, names of parties, and briefly describing the land transferred, and was compiled by Wood from records at the Bureau of Conveyances in Honolulu. The original documents were in microform, and the recording information was added and annotated by Wood. Similar files document land conveyances from others. There are two indexes and copies of original documents, 1875-1936, both compiled by Wood. One of the indexes was compiled by Wood from the Kauai Grantee's Index at the Bureau of Conveyances. The latter is an original record and contains

Woods extended notes about the transactions, the history of the land and prior transactions, rents, and related topics. Finally, there are copies of Princeville Plantation Company land conveyances from others, 1880- 1936; and a list of plantation officers, 1925, which is a handwritten document compiled by Wood from Men in Hawaii.
