A MESSAGE FROM RANDY WICHMAN, INTERIM PRESIDENT

The passing of our President Bob Schleck left a critical void in our Society that needed to be filled immediately. Thanks to the persuasive powers of many, especially our wonderful staff, I was convinced to sign on as your Interim President, to be ratified during our Annual Meeting in May.

In short order, new priorities have been quickly established. The first was the public closure during 2019. As most of our limited staff time is spent on public research request with minimal returns to the Society, we needed to focus this staff time on internal matters during 2019.

The second and third priorities are the Annual and Corporate Appeals. The Annual Appeal has gone out and the returns from our membership are incredibly generous at such a critical time. More on this in our next newsletter. The Corporate Appeal is well underway and should be out in early January.

Our fourth and fifth priorities are to build the best grant writing team the Society has ever seen, and then to rebuild our volunteer corps with the talents necessary to set the foundation needed for the next 100 years.

Our sixth and seventh priorities are to publish the work of Tambi Larsen's stunning artwork in book form with help from S. W. Wilcox Trust grant, and to increase our on-line presence.

We will also begin the task of digitizing our collection of maps beginning with Kekaha Plantation, through the generosity of a grant from the G.N. Wilcox Trust.

2019 looks to be an exciting year and we urge all of you to join us in the trenches for a focused drive to preserve our historical legacy.



Historian Randy Wichman gave an overview of the resources that are available and accessible at Kauai Historical Society and shared items of interest from our collections.


Koloa Village hand-drawn map, circa 1888, by Henry Blake

Peter Kovacik of Canada held the winning bid on a beautiful quilt created by Pat Littlejohn and donated to the Kauai Quilt Show sponsored by Kauai Quilt Guild, Nene Quilters, Vicky's Fabric, Kapaia Stitchery & Discount Fabric Warehouse. Jeni Conley presented Kauai Historical Society, Peter Kovacik's non-profit of choice, a \$2,960 check from this February event.



Through the efforts of Helen Wong Smith, former Executive Director of Kauai Historical Society and member of the Association of Hawaii Archivists, along with facilitator, Mina Ellison of the Hawaii Historical Society, Kauai Historical Society partnered with Hawaii Council for the Humanities (HCH), Association of Hawaii Archivists (AHA), Chris Faye of Hui O Laka Kokee, and Sabra Kauka of Island School who graciously provided the location to host this October presentation.

Chris Faye shared slides of a wide range of quilts and described each one's unique design qualities; Sabra Kauka spoke to the intricacies of kapa making and storage of kapa, with sample kapa on view; and Helen Wong Smith shared her knowledge of proper care and storage of quilts, providing tips on cleaning and storage.


Refreshments and lunch were provided by Hawaii Council for the Humanities.

Donovan Preza is a Hawaiian Studies instructor at Kapiolani Community College and a PhD Student in Geography at UH Manoa.



John Clark, born and raised on Oahu, a graduate of UH Manoa, a retired Deputy Fire Chief, and an avid surfer.







Through the sponsorship of Makaloa Native Hawaiian Council, Ku Pono I Hookahi Hawaii, and the Kauai Historical Society, Donovan Preza and John Clark shared their knowledge in their respective, specialized areas of expertise.

Pualii Fukino-Rossi, Hawaiian Studies Instructor and Kauai Historical Society Board of Directors Member, organized and facilitated these events. The Society had the opportunity to host attendees at the Hawaiian Studies classroom on the campus of Kauai Community College in the month of November.

<u>Donovan Preza:</u> Taking Ownership of Ownership - Western Property Law's Assimilation Into Hawaii's Property Law in the Great Mahele Era

Donovan's presentation focused on the 1848 Mahele, Hawaii's transition to private property, and how Hawaiian property law adopted and assimilated with Western property conceptions, thereby forming a unique system of property law found nowhere else in the world.

John Clark: Wahi Nalu, Wahi Kai - Traditional Surf & Beach Sites of Kauai

Traditional place names tell a story about our islands through the eyes of our kupuna. By knowing these sites, we are able to honor those who came before us and the legacies they left behind. John Clark shared traditional surf sites and ancient place names related to the beaches on Kauai.

His knowledge in place names comes from his years of research and is portrayed in his many publications, including 'Beaches of Kauai and Niihau' and 'Kalaupapa Place Names'.

We had the pleasure of once again hosting the History Museum at The Shops at Kukuiula for the week of July 23 to July 27. Mahalo to Jana & Chuck Blay and the many volunteers who tirelessly worked to share the history of Koloa.








Tambi Larsen One Hundred Entertainments
